



## Special permission for a TCI training course

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An instructor in training may apply for special permission as part of the graduation procedure so that the mandatory, independently led seminar is recognised as a TCI training course for participants.

Special permission may be granted once to instructors in training who are experienced group leaders if they can demonstrate why this course should be recognised as a TCI training course.

### **The application should include:**

- Relevant personal information about the applicant
- The reasons for conducting the course and applying for special permission
- A description of the objectives and motives pursued with this course
- The text of the planned announcement
- A detailed outline of the first three sessions, possible modules and contents, in particular methodological teaching elements

### **Procedure**

The applicant must submit the application to the International Education Committee IEC in good time: [education@ruth-cohn-institute.org](mailto:education@ruth-cohn-institute.org).

The IEC will process the application as quickly as possible, suggest any changes and engage in a professional exchange with the applicant if necessary.

It will communicate its decision in writing, stating the reasons.

### **Further regulations**

- If the IEC grants special permission, the course can be published as a training course in the RCI media, in particular on the course platform: [tci-living-learning.org](http://tci-living-learning.org).
- On the confirmation of participation, the course instructor shall note that the IEC has granted special permission and the date on which this was granted, and that the course is therefore recognised as a TCI training course.
- This special permission does not entitle the person to make recommendations within the framework of TCI training.
